Convention Welcomes New Manager

As Convention Manager Ryan Lewis makes final preparations for his first convention, he quickly admits that he is still adjusting to the new role.

With a grin, he says, "I really don't know how I ended up in this position, but I am enjoying the opportunity, and I am grateful!"

The annual meeting has been a constant for the 26-year-old southern Illinois native. "As far as I know, I have only missed one convention in my life—the 1986 convention in Tulsa. It would be hard to imagine my life without it."

It is the task of the convention manager to make sure each convention runs smoothly and efficiently—no small task when you consider the average attendance of nearly 6,000 people and the wide variety of meetings and events taking place over a six-day period. Planning begins at least 10 years prior to each meeting and demands careful organization, communication, and record keeping.

"It is definitely a challenge," said Lewis. "The biggest surprise for me has been the many years of planning that go into a single convention. Thankfully, I am an organized and people-oriented person, and these skills have proven valuable in the convention-planning process."

The young planner is quick to point out that he has big plans for the event. "I would like to build on the great success of my predecessors, and I realize I have big shoes to fill. I want to continue to develop the opportunities for growth, fellowship, and encouragement that this convention has to offer."

In addition to planning the national convention, Ryan serves as executive administrator for the Executive Office. He is responsible for the logistics of the annual Free Will Baptist Leadership Conference (held in Nashville, Tennessee, each December), coordinates disaster relief efforts for the denomination, implements stewardship training, and manages www.fwbpastor.com, a website currently



under revision for pastors and church leaders.

"Every pastor needs resources, and I want the website to become one of the best. From sermon topics to illustrations, outreach ideas, and helpful articles about life and ministry, I want fwbpastor. com to be a relevant and helpful tool for every pastor and church leader." The revised site is expected to launch late this fall.

As he looks back, Ryan points to his dad as the biggest influence on his life and ministry. The long-

time pastor of Blue Point FWB Church in Cisne, IL, Ernie Lewis is also the assistant clerk of the National Association. "Dad has been the greatest example of a ministry-minded, selfless servant that I have ever seen," Ryan said. "He lives a 'real' Christian life, and it is evident in everything he says and does."

When asked what he would be doing if he had not embraced his new role as convention manager, Ryan smiles broadly. "Who knows? I coached a high school basketball team last year and loved every minute of it. But God has directed my steps to this position, and, honestly, right now, I don't have time to think about anything but getting through my first convention."

During this session, Dr. James Stevens will teach practical techniques for keyboard, including smooth modulations and transitions between songs and the basics of understanding a chord chart.
